The Bulletin publishes short research contributions in ceramic studies in general, but preferentially in ceramic petrology, including research papers dealing with ceramic conservation studies. Ceramic studies in archaeology scope a broad range of research topics, thus papers to be submitted are not restricted to any theoretical and methodological approach.

Papers must have a maximum of 15 A4 pages, simple-spaced, letter Tw Cen MT 10,5 , a maximum of 6 figures (included photographs and graphics), and 2 tables. Papers will be peer-reviewed by 2 academic referees. Currently, the LP&CC Bulletin is published in full colour as .pdf format, and in W&B printed version.

The next deadline to receive the papers will be **30th, November 2014**.

The *Bulletin of Laboratory of Petrology and Ceramic Conservation* is the bi-annual academic and scientific publication of our Laboratory, as part of Escuela de Arqueología, Universidad Nacional de Catamarca.

The Bulletin publishes original and unpublished short research papers. Brief Notes and Literature Reviews are also accepted, although the later will be required by editors.

Editorial Guidelines

Papers must have a maximum extension of 15 A4 pages, simple-spaced, 2,5 cms. left and right margins, and 3 cms. higher and lower margins. Typography must be preferentially Tw Cen MT10,5 or Times New Roman 12. Illustrations should be in full colour with a maximum of 6 (included photographs and graphics), and 2 tables. Papers must be written using Office Word 97-2003 version.

Titles (Tw Cen MT, size 10,5)

Title of paper: centred, bold, capitalised the first letter of each word.

Author/s: leave a space, centred, normal (letter Tw Cen MT, size 10,5).

Institutional affiliation: immediately below the authors, normal, centered; name/s, surname/s, academic institution, full address, contact email (only the first author); if more than one author put a super-index reference with a number (letter Tw Cen MT, size 10,5).

Main titles: bold, left justified, Tw Cen MT, size 10,5.

Secondary titles: italics, left justified, Tw Cen MT, size 10,5.

Abstract: in English and Spanish with no more than 100 words (for English written papers, the editor will provide the Spanish abstract)

Key words: four key words in English and Spanish.

Tables: preferentially done in Word text processor, included in the main text of the paper, although they can be done also in Excel and inserted as independent object in the text.

Figures: all illustrations including graphs will be named as Figures, and correlated numbered. They must be in full color (300 dpi resolution minimum, but preferentially in 600 dpi); .tiff or .jpg format. Each figure must have 2,5Mb in size (max.).

Notes: at the end of the main text, just before the References section, using the Word processor.

Reference Section: use the Harvard style reference system.
